#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The fall camporee is a special event in our district each year. Units will camp over the weekend, Friday-Sunday, and Webelos are expected to camp with a troop. Our location this year will be Horsetooth Reservoir, which is located west of Ft. Collins. We will be doing a conservation project which helps us Reduce our costs for the event. Of course, we will have many fun activities for the Scouts to enjoy.

#### 2. LOCATION

As stated above the camporee will be at Horsetooth reservoir which is located West of Ft. Collins. See the section below for driving directions. The estimated drive time from the Arvada area is about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours.

#### 3. REGISTRATION AND FEE

You will be able to register at the August, September and October Roundtables, at the Scout office or preferably on-line **until October 8**<sup>th</sup> with a cost of \$15 per participant. After October 8<sup>th</sup> the cost will be \$20 per participant.

If you come just for Saturday, the fee will be \$12 per participant. Everyone who attends the camporee must pay the appropriate registration fee.

We are encouraging the Cub Scout Pack to attend not just the Webelos. The Pack will be camping with a troop, we need them to be registered separately, by pack #. This enables your unit to obtain credit for camping, which is part of your unit's Journey to Excellence (JTE) objectives.

Upon registering, troops will be able to select their campsites. You are allowed 8 people and 4 tents per campsite.

#### 4. PARKING AND UNLOADING

Please follow the directions of the traffic control people and be patient. As at summer camp, we do not want vehicles parked in the campsites. After unloading please move vehicles to the parking areas. A troop trailer may be left in the campsite along with ONE vehicle. No mobile homes or campers are to be used unless due to medical reasons. Prior approval must be arranged with the district program/activities chairperson.

#### CAMP SET-UP AND TAKE DOWN

Please DO NOT arrive prior to 3:00 PM on Friday. Unit should plan to depart by 10:30 AM on Sunday. Units that need to leave on Saturday should try to stay through the campfire on Saturday night.

Please check in at Headquarters (HQ) after you get to your campsite.

Please turn in all medical forms, unit roster of participants, payment receipt and finalize any money that is due for additional people not previously registered. Payment must be by check or cash only.

Be sure to check with HQ to obtain unit ribbon and participant recognition, which will be given out after the church service on Sunday morning.

#### 6. FIRE AND WATER

We expect that open fires will be allowed in the grates provided. This of course will depend on fire restrictions at the time of the event. Use of stoves for cooking is required. NO FLAMES IN TENTS. This includes no cooking in tents.

Water will be available near the campsites.

#### 7. FIRST AID – MEDICAL FORMS

First Aid emergencies should be directed to the medical staff, Crew 911. Minor first aid opportunities should be handled by the individual unit.

All participants must have a completed Medical Form with parts A & B completed at a minimum. Using a recent medical form, completed in the last year, can be used, such as those for summer camp, Day camp, etc.

Medical forms will be returned to the unit, except if a participant was seen by our medical staff.

#### 8. CUBS IN CAMP

Each Scout troop is encouraged to invite Packs to the Camporee, not just the Webelos. Following YPT pack are to have a minimum of 2 adults. Packs are to check in at registration (HQ) upon arrival. If you are coming only for Saturday, it is suggested that you arrive by 8:00 AM Saturday. If you have other obligations you can arrive at any time though.

#### 9. SCHEDULE

A schedule is included with this packet. It is subject to change but is our best effort currently. Please make copies for all of your participants.

#### 10. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

We are still finalizing the events, but you can be assured there will be those that are fun as well as challenging. All events are open to all youth.

There will be archery, hawks, gaga court, fishing, canoeing, Dutch oven sampling and of course ROOT BEER. Remember you need your **own cup** for the root beer. Water bottles will not be filled.

As mentioned, we will be doing a conservation project. The project will entail cutting old trees, shrubs, so bring loppers, small tree saws, no chain saws, gloves and eye protection. Be sure to label tools with your name and unit number.

#### 11. EQUIPMENT

It is strongly encouraged that all participants have their 10 camping essentials. HINT: refer to your Scout handbook.

#### 12. LATRINES

The restrooms will be available for our use. Remember they are for human waste only. Remember the 11<sup>th</sup> point of the Scout Law. CLEAN.

Some of the campsites will be used by the public so also be COURTEOUS.

#### 13. TRASH

ALL UNITS MUST TAKE ALL OF THEIR OWN TRASH HOME WITH THEM.

This includes fire ashes. What you pack in, you pack out. Fire grates are to be clean when you leave.

#### 14. CAMPSITES

As noted above, troops will be able to select their campsites if they register at roundtable. If you register on-line you will be contacted to select your campsite(s).

A map is included, for your reference. Please make copies for your participants.

#### 15. DISTRICT EMAIL

If you are not currently registered for the Gateway email, which contains a header of GATEWAY-INFO, then send an email to John Beattie, <a href="mailto:jvbeatt@q.com">jvbeatt@q.com</a> with your name and unit number. You will then be added to the email service.

It will be via this email that you will receive any updates for the camporee or other Gateway District news.

#### 16. CHECK-IN PROCESS

Only one adult needs to come to registration (HQ)

- 1. Turn in a completed roster (attached) of all participants.
- 2. Turn in medical forms for ALL participants.
- 3. Show receipt of payment made. Should match the number of participants on the roster.
- 4. Pay for additional participants at the standard rate, if the unit registered before the dead line.
- 5. All vehicles must have a PARKING PASS (attached) displayed on their dashboard. Please make copies of all the attached forms where required, for your unit.
- 6. Remember the council policy of no refunds, but you can certainly replace with a new participant.

#### 17. YOUTH PROTECTION (YPT)

All registered adults **MUST** take the new YPT by Sept. 30th, if they have not already done so. It too is recommended for all other adults who attend District and Council events.
